Cost of providing modern contraceptive services to current users in the developing world

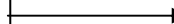
**\$7.1 billion (2003)\***



Prevents...

- 187 million unintended pregnancies
- 60 million unplanned births
- 105 million induced abortions
- 22 million spontaneous abortions
- 2.7 million infant deaths
- 215,000 pregnancy-related deaths
- 685,000 children from losing their mothers

**Around 200 million women have an unmet need for contraceptive services\*\***



## UNMET NEED

Cost of providing modern contraceptive services to meet the unmet need in the developing world

**\$3.9 billion (2003)\*\*\***



Would prevent a further...

- 52 million unintended pregnancies
- 23 million unplanned births
- 22 million induced abortions
- 7 million spontaneous abortions
- 1.4 million infant deaths
- 142,000 pregnancy-related deaths
- 505,000 children from losing their mothers
